Inilunsad ng Pamahalaang Lungsod ang higit na pinaunlad na programang pangkalusugan at kagalingang panlipunan na tinatatawag na VC Cares Program.

Ayon kay Mayor WIN, ang isang kumprehensibong programa katiad ng VC Cares ay napakahalaga para sa bawat Valenzuelano, lalung-lalo na ang mga mahihirap.

Ang nasabing programa ay nahahati sa dalawa: pangkalusugan at pangkagalingang panlipunan.

Sa pangkalusugan, layunin nito na makapagbigay ng bago, mas maayos na kagamitan at may tamang bilang ng empleyado sa Emergency Hospital; mapabuti ang kalusugan at nutrisyon ng mga bata at kababaihan; makapagbigay ng epektibong disease control at prevention measures; at mapalago ng outreach projects.

Sa pangkagalingang panlipunan naman, layunin nitong mapaunlad ang pagbibigay ng tulong sa mga mahihirap; makapagbigay ng komprehensibong programa para sa kapakanan at proteksyon ng mga bata; mas maayos na programa para sa mga may kapansanan at pagbibigay ng tulong sa mga kababaihan sa panahon ng krisis; at, mas maayos na pagbibigay ng tulong sa mga senior citizens.

Dagdag pa dito, magkakaroon ng isang database upang masiguro na tanging mga kwalipikadong magbebenepepsiyo sa programa.

"Ang mahalaga dito sa VC Cares Program ay ang data banking. Ang Social Welfare Office ay nagsasagawa ng door-to-door assessment upang matukoy kung sino talaga ang mga walang kakayahang magbayad o kung sino ang mga kayang magbayad kahit kaunti," paliwanag ni Mayor WIN.

"Kapag may database ka, mapapabilis ang pagpoproseso ng mga paperes upang makakuha ng tulong mula sa lokal na pamahalaan. Hindi mo na kailangang mangalap lagi ng mga kinakailangang dokumento upang magberipika," dagdag pa niya.

Ayon pa sa Punong Lungsod, magsisilbing equalizer ang programa dahil aayusin at paunlarin nito ang paghahati ng serbisyo, lalo na at limítado ang pondo ng Lungsod kung kaya't nararapat lamang na gamitin ito ng maayos.

May 13 priority areas ang tinukoy para sa programa at nag-umpisa sa Northville 1 at 2 sa Barangay Bignay at Sitio kabutuan sa Barangay Gen. T. De Leon bilang pilot areas. May dalawang klase ng VC Cares card na ipapamigay ang Lokal na Pamahalaan (pula at bugay).

Ang pula ay ibibigay sa mga kwalipikadong indigents, may kapanasan at senior citizens para sa libreng serbisyo ng pangkalusugan. Ang bugay naman ay ibibigay sa mga rehistradong residente ng Lungsod.

Convenience & Better Service with New City Government Center

'One stop shop. Faster, more convenient service. Bigger, more comfortable taxpayer's lounge. More parking space.'

These are just but a few of what taxpayers in the City should watch out for when the new City Government Center opens early next month. Located on a 2,227.5sq. meters lot along McArthur Highway, the three-storey building will house all revenue-generating offices such as the City Treasury and the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO).

The City Government Center is designed to provide a more convenient workplace for our employees. I personally believe that a bigger and better working space is one way of improving their performance, and this would mean satisfaction for all clients," said City Mayor WIN. "It would provide a more convenient taxpayers lounge, as all revenue-generating offices are located in one place. They do not have to go from one office



to another or from one building to the other just to process their business permits or pay their real property taxes," he explained.

"This is just the first phase of the City Government Center. Another building will be constructed to accommodate the other offices," Mayor WIN said.

The old City Hall building, which was built in 1967, is too cramped. It cannot accommodate all of the offices (including some national offices) and the almost 3,000 employees of the City Government. Even the extension

building is not enough. With this, the City Government spends about P3.3 million annually for office space rentals in private buildings to house some of its offices like the Human Resource Management Office and the City Council.

"If we have a wider City hall, we will be saving as much as P3.3 million, which means more resources to fund other development projects and programs directly needed by our constituents," he said.

The second phase will house a multi-purpose hall for activities of employees and

a day care center for employees' children.

Through the VC Biz Bills Program, the City Government streamlined the internal rules and procedures concerning the processing of business permits, building permits, certificates of occupancy and such other application areas from 10 to four (4) easy steps. To ensure that taxpayers do not fall hapless victims of illegal fixers and eliminate red tape, Mayor WIN encourages taxpayers to transact only over designated counters and personnel in plain view of everyone.

The new taxpayers lounge will not have drawers and tables inside the offices. There will be a Customer Complaints Desk to handle all queries such as assessment and billing. All complaints and questions received are logged by the Customer Complaints Action Officer, as well as the corresponding action taken on such complaints and questions.

INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT

Taking advantage of the dry season, the City Government undertook several road and sidewalk improvement projects, all over the City.

"The road to land area ratio in Valenzuela City is quite low for an industrial city. We only have .78-kilometer road for every 1 hectare," Mayor WIN reveals.

"Given this situation, it is necessary to ensure that all our major and arterial roads are in good condition to facilitate the transport of goods and services in and around the City, as well as ensure the safety and convenience of materials and commuters," he explains.

To date, a total of 38.85 kilometers of the city's major roads (including national roads) are being repaired and improved. Among these roads are Mc Arthur Highway, Maysan Road, M.H. Del Pilar, G. Lazaro Street, Gov. I. Santiago Street, Gen. T. De Leon Road, Kamaluan Road, Sapang Bakaw Road, Gen. Luis Road, Lawang Bato Service Road, Mapulang Lupa Service Road, Camaray Service Road, Coloong Road, Que Grande Road, Apolonia Street, Tatalon Street, Sto. Rosario Street, Paso de Blas/Parada Service Road, F. Bautista Street, and Kabesang Potong Street.

Various barangay road projects were also undertaken, which include the concreting of Bautista St. (Zone 5), Palasan, concreting of Isla Road (Zone 5 & 6), Isla; concreting of Old Prodón St., Gen. T. De Leon; concreting of Deato Compound Pathway, Zone 1-A, Palasan; improvement of Victoria Village, Canamay; improvement of Sto. Rosario St., Mapulang Lupa; improvement of roads and drainage at Kalamansi St., Balangkas; improvement of P. Dela Cruz St., Ugong; rip-rapping of R.O.W. to MPH, Pariancillo Villa; and, improvement of Sitio Tatalon St., Ugong.

These road projects do not only benefit Valenzuelans, but also neighboring City's because there are some roads being repaired that serve as an alternate route like the Gen. T. De Leon Road. It is an alternate road to Sta. Quiteria in Caloocan City, which connects to Tandang Sora in Quezon City.

Alongside the improvement of roads is the strengthening of the use of sidewalks, which proves to be effective, in easing traffic along the City's main thoroughfares.

Middle of last year, the City Government launched its Buhayin ang Sidewalk Program through its City Engineering Office, to improve the condition of sidewalks and encourage pedestrians to use them for their safety and prevent them from causing traffic on the road.

In nearly a year of sidewalk construction, rehabilitation and improvement works, the City Government was able to complete many of its sidewalk projects along major thoroughfares, particularly Maysan Road, Gen. T. De Leon Road, Our Lady of Fatima, and Gov. T. Santiago Road.

"Naturuwa kami at inayos na ang sidewalk dito sa amin. Mulaking tulog ito paru sa aming mga mag-aaral," said Delia Demetillo, owner of Our Lady of Lourdes School in Binangonan Gen. T. De Leon.

"Matagal na naming inaabang na mapayad ng lokal na pamahalaan," Demetillo quipped.

Furthermore, Virginia Leonor, head of the Demolition Division, says, "It is a fulfillment on our part that many appreciate what we are doing. They support the programs and projects of Mayor Win and the City Government. While there are some who are indifferent about this project, many are happy that we are doing this."

There are even some residents who voluntarily demolished their structures that encroach the sidewalks, making the implementation faster," she shares.

"All of these projects are 100% locally funded, and we are proud that this City can work on its development projects without having to depend on national funds," Leonor proudly said.

We have even funded the repair of some portions of national roads," she added.

The intensive road and sidewalk rehabilitation projects, including the improvement of drainage systems, which amount to Php 200 Million, come from the City Government's General Fund and loan.

"Mahalaga ring mapagluunan ng pansiñ ang kapakanan ng mga guro upang mahikayat sila na patuloy na maging matapat sa paghubog sa isipan ng kanilang mga mag-aaral," ani pa Mayor WIN. Patuloy din ang Pamahalaang Lungsod sa pagpapaayos at pagpapagawa ng mga karagdagang paligsahan upang matugunan ang pagdami ng bilang ng mag-aaral bawat taon. Isa maginagawang paaralan ay ang Gen. T. De Leon National High School na may 40 sili-aralan.

NPD lauds Mayor Win



Mayor WIN was awarded a plaque of appreciation by the Northern Police District for his invaluable and untiring support to the police force, especially the Valenzuela City Police Office.

The award is in recognition of the Local Chief Executive's efforts of upgrading the efficiency of police officers in the City in combating crime.

Acknowledging the PNP's very limited budget to cover all requirements for effective police operations, Mayor WIN, upon assuming office as father of the City, vowed support to the local police.

"We realize that the maintenance of peace and order is an imperative to local economic development, that is why we at the City Government do what we can to augment the logistical needs of our local police force."

"In the recent years, we have witnessed the transformation of the Philippine National Police into a more capable, effective and credible force to combat crime," he said. "This is a very difficult task, given the budgetary and logistical limitations facing the police force.

Only 8% of the budget supports the daily administrative and operational requirements of police offices and stations nationwide, while most of the funds go to personnel services, which include salaries and allowances of personnel," he explained.

To date, the City Government turned-over 19 motorcycles, eight (8) Isuzu crosswind, five (5) Toyota revo, 100 maglites, 42 handheld radios, and one (1) Kia panoramic van.

"We have to do our share in maintaining peace and order because we believe that our common goals can only be achieved through the consolidation of efforts between the local government and the police force," he stressed.

"In giving our full support to the Valenzuela City Police, we have not been disappointed. Our local police has made significant gains in terms of crime prevention, suppression and crime solution. We have also seen a general decline in crime incidents due to increased police visibility," he said.

Mayor WIN also thanked Valenzuela Police Chief Billy Beltran for steering the dedicated men and women of the VCPO into dynamic action in the fight against crime, and NPD Chief Superintendent Leopoldo Bataoil for his support to the VCPO. Moreover, the Valenzuela Police is awaiting the delivery of one (1) panoramic van, two (2) Isuzu crosswind and 37 handheld radios.

Dr. Pio's 137th Birth Anniversary Celebration

And soon it shall come to pass that history books would only talk about Dr. Pio Valenzuela's heroism in cursory, as his proud sons and daughters bring to the fore his untold bravery, commitment to service and love for his country.

On his 137th birth anniversary, the City Government turned its complex into a mini Broadway for its first ever produced musical play dubbed "Nom de Plume: Madlang-Away". "Nom de plume: Madlang-Away is a stage play on the life of Dr. Pio, a Bulakenyo illustrado who was one of the triumvirate of the Katipunan and founder of the Kalayaan (official organ of the revolutionary movement), along with Andres Bonifacio and Emilio Jacinto.

"It is sad that not too many people knew about his heroism, what he sacrificed for our country. He was the soldier left behind by the battle, scarred and bruised, but nevertheless, very much alive then," expressed Mayor WIN.

"What I admired most about him was that he went on living and fighting. He lived his life for others, and fought for their rights, even after the war has ended," Mayor WIN told.

"Nom de plume: Madlang-Away is a musical play that fondly looks back on the life of Dr. Pio Valenzuela and hopefully envisions a bright future for our City," he added.

Performed by Arnold Reyes (ZsaZsa Zaturnnah's Dodong) and 30 students from various high schools and colleges in the City, all members of the Valenzuela City Center for the Performing Arts (VC-CPA), the musical portrays how Madlang-Away (Dr. Pio) raged against injustice, corruption and apathy against the oppressive Spaniards and his commitment to service.

"Kamanga-manga ang naging pag-sadulsa sa buhay ni Dr. Pio," said National Artist Napoleon Abueva, the sculptor of the triumvirate clay sculpture displayed in the new 500 seater audito-



rium, the home base of the VCCPA.

"The play is not simply a way to enlighten viewers of this hero's vital role in our country's history, but more importantly, it inspires us to work unselfishly and contribute for the development of our country," Abueva added.

Madlang-Away's exemplary achievements underlie the Gawad Dr. Pio Valenzuela, which recognizes Valenzuelano men and women who have exhibited excellence in their respective fields and made significant contributions in nation building and community development.

Conferred the 2006 Dr. Pio Valenzuela medal of honor were Thelma Galang (Education), Tyson Kristian Rome Tiu Sy (Sports), Engr. Restituto Bautista (Profession), Porfirio Rodriguez (Science and Technology), Jerry Gracio (Literature), Ibarra Samson (Journalism), Bernard Clarino (Community Service), Former Vice Mayor Isidoro Arenas (Government Service), and Former Mayor Geronimo Angeles (Natalatang Gawad).

Through the musical play and the gawad, Mayor Gatchalian quips, "It is my dearest wish that each and every Valenzuelano, young and old alike, will come to know Dr. Pio better. He is so much more than just the name of a city north of Metro Manila. He is our hero, our guide, and our father."

Madlang-Away became Governor of the Province of Bulacan and the first Mayor of the old town of Polo, now the City of Valenzuela. He died on April 6, 1956.

And, if Madlang-away has lived up to this day, he could have seen how proud his sons and daughters are of him-- a Katipunero, a gentleman, a doctor, and a hero.

New Heavy Equipment

In its bid to upgrade its efficiency in the delivery of services for Valenzuelanos, the City Government has acquired additional heavy equipment and facilities for its offices under the City Action Center and Engineering Office.

"If we are well-equipped, we can double our waste collection efficiency, fasttrack our clearing activities on drainage systems and waterways, and be able to undertake big infrastructure projects without having to rely on contractors who have the needed equipment," said Mayor WIN.

The City Mayor also pointed that if the City Government is able to undertake major infrastructure projects, it would mean savings for the City coffers as the City Government is spared from paying contractor's fees (mobilization fees and contingency fees).

"This would also enable our employees concern, to have close supervision of project implementation, thus maximizing their capabilities," he added.

Funded under the P40 million loan, the City Government purchased one Komatsu payloader, one Mitsubishi payloader, two wheeled excavators with breaker, five heavy dump trucks, one crane trucks, 10 mini dump trucks, and two

utility trucks.

Also in the list of equipment to be purchased are additional dump trucks, utility trucks, crane trucks, water tankers, road grader, manlift truck, self-loader truck, mobile generator, backhoe and tow trucks.

Action Center in Focus (First Part)



Many of them we see working in the City's main thoroughfares- sweeping litter, dredging drainages, collecting garbage, clearing sidewalks or directing traffic. While others ply the rivers and creeks that are swamped with garbage, still others are in the motorpool busy putting vehicles back to running condition.

Police, street sweepers, truck drivers, sidewalk cleaners, traffic enforcers, mechanics, camioneros, environment police—they are the key cast of the everyday drama at the center of action, the Valenzuela City Action Center.

True to being the center of action, work for its employees, especially those in the field, is not limited to the typical five-day, eight-to-five work routine. Work here is on a 24/7 basis, rain or shine.

Composed of five (5) offices: Waste Management Office (WMO), Rivers and Waterways Management Office (RWMO), Traffic Management Office (TMO), Public Order Safety and Management Office (POSOMO), and Motorpool, the Action Center is tasked to provide better public service and affirm the thrust of the City of giving primordial consideration to the welfare of Valenzuelans and its constituents.

Waste Management Office

Patience works simply wonderful on this part of the Action Center. Being the lead office in ensuring the efficient management of waste in the City, exposure to stinky garbage is very likely, hence patience is one virtue that its work force has to possess.

"Mahalo man o madungon, mahal namin ang aming trabaho," said Elio San Andres, one of the garbage truck drivers.

"Mahalo naga, matagal naman. Sa simpleng paraan ito, natataguyod namin ang aming mga pamilya, nakakatulong pa kamsa sa kalikasan ng Valenzuela," he proudly said.

"Kung hindi namin mahal ang aming trabaho, hindi kami magtagtag dito. Siguro wala pang isang linggo inwan na namin ang aming trabaho," adds Pablo Delesmo Jr., a police.

"Kailangan ng tyaga at pagpaparensya sa trabahong ito. Dapat kalmedo ka lang kapag nakakastugip ka ng mga reklamo mula sa isang residente na nagcsabing hindi daw namin nahakot ang basura sa kanilang lugar."



"May ibang nagbayad ng kakaibang mula, meron ding nakuhol, at may mga nag-community service. Walo doon sa 212 ay illegal dumpsite ang kaso," he narrates.

"We want to show our constituents that we are serious in our campaign of making Valenzuela clean and illegal dumpsite-free," he stressed.



Anti-Dengue Operations PINAITING

Abala ang Health Department ng Pamahalaang Lungsod sa pagpasagawa ng mga hakbang upang malwasan ang paglagnan ng dengue sa Lungsod at maialis ang Lungsod sa talaan ng limang dengue-prone areas sa Metro Manila.

"Kasama ng Waste management Office, ang ating mga health personnel ay abala sa pagpasagawa ng mga anti-dengue information drive, paglinis at fogging operations sa buong Valenzuela, lalung-lalo na sa District II, kung saan naitala ang pinakamaraming bilang ng dengue cases," ani Mayor WIN.

Spesipikabagong ulat ng Department of Health ang Valenzuelanamay 196 dengue cases, ay kasamasaatalaan ng limang lugarnamay pinakamataas na hablang.

"Inumpisahan ng Lokal na Pamahalaan ang maigting na kampanya nito laban sa dengue noong Mayo 25. Nagsagawa kami ng Oplan Sita sa Blocks 1 hanggang 7 ng Sitio Kabatuan kung saan inispeksyon ang bawat bahay at nilinis ang mga lugar na maaring pamugnay ng mga lamok na nagdadalha ng sakit na dengue," ani pa Mayor WIN.

Noong araw ding iyon (May 25), inumpisahan ang awareness at health education campaign, maging fogging operations sa lahat ng pampublikong paaralan bilang pagbabusig ng klase.

"Nagkaroon din ng second fogging operations bilang follow-up, sa mga eskwelahan noong June 10 at 11 upang masigurong ligtas ang mga bata sa dengue," dagdag ni City Epidemiologist Manuel Mapue.

Nagtapon din ang lahat ng Kapitan sa Lungsod upang pagusapan kung paano puksain ang mga lamok na nagdadalha ng namamatay na sakit ni dengue sa kanilang mga hasasakupan.

Sa kasalukuyan, nakkipag-usap ang City Health Department sa mga School Principals upang bumuo ng "Little Dengue Brigades" sa bawat paaralan, na naglatayong gawing aktibong kasama ang mga mag-aaral sapagpuksang dengue.

Ang mga miyembro ng nasabing brigada ay mag-ikot sa kanilang mga paaralan at tutukuyin ang mga lugar na maaring maging breeding ground ng mga lamok na nagdadalha ng dengue, at nilinis ang mga

Earthquake & Fire Preparedness Drill

With the alarming earthquake incidents in some parts of the country and in other parts of the world, the City joined the rest of the nation in the fire and earthquake preparedness drill on June 20.

Earthquake drills were conducted simultaneously in all 62 private and public schools in Valenzuela including the City Hall.

"Although the City is not located along or near a fault line, it would still be best to be prepared for any eventuality," Mayor WIN said.

To efficiently monitor the event, each school assigned drill marshals and first aid team.

According to Mayor WIN, it is important to assess the fire and earthquake awareness and preparedness of school officials and students, and conduct fire and earthquake safety-related seminars.

Furthermore, the Mayor advised the Local Fire Department to inspect fire safety facilities in all schools and establishments as fire incidents continuous to plague areas in the metropolis, even after the summer season is gone.

Fiscal Management

Income

The City Government posted higher income in 2005 with a total collection of P 1,245 Billion, against P 1,018 Billion in 2004. There is an increase of P 227 Million in income.

This increase is a combined result of extensive tax collection efforts, vigorous information campaign, diligent tax mapping, and auction of real properties with long standing delinquencies.

Savings

The City Government generated an aggregate savings of P 117 Million in 2005, against only P 21 Million in 2004.

Sa kabilang malakas na pag-buhos ng ulan dala ng bagyo, masaya pa ring ipinagdiriwang ng mga Valenzuelano na pinanguahan ni Mayor Win, ang Kapistahan ni San Roque sa pamamagitan ng sayawan sa calle sa saliw ng drum at brass band.

"Kung naghahanap ka ng asawa, dito ka pumunta," ani Vice Mayor Tony Espiritu na nagpahayag sa paniniwala ng mga deboto na

kung sinumang mamintaksi sa Mahal na Partron upang makahanap ng asawa ay ipinagkalooban nito. Ayon kay Espiritu, siya at dalawa pang kasamaan sa opisina ay nakahanap ng asawa pagkatapos sumali sa sayawan sa calle.

Makaraang lisanin ng mga British troops ang kanilang lugar, bumalik ang mga residente at agad tinuno ang simbahang San Roque. Inilibas nila ang imahen ng Mahal na Patron at isinayaw sa kalye, at sila ay gumaling.

Bagamat hindi malinaw kung kailan nagsimula ang paniniwala na ang Mahal na patron ay hindi lamang isang manggagamot kundi Patron din ng mga naghahanap makakasama s'buhay. Ang kapistahan ni San Roque ay August 16 sa Catholic calendar, ngunit para sa mga valenzuelano, ipinagdiriwang nila ito sa tuwing 12 ng Mayo.

Ito din ang tanging kapistahan ng mga Katoliko sa bansa na kung saan ang prusisyon ay ginaganap sa umaga sa halip na umaga. "Ang kapistahan na ito ay nagsimula pa noong 1600 at masaya ako na patuloy itong ipinagdiriwang ng mga Valenzuelano hanggang ngayon," ani Mayor Win.

Sa ngayon, ang kapistahan ni San Roque na ay isa sa mga natitirang orihinal na pista ng bayan sa kalakhang Maynila na napanatili ang daling kulay at tingkad nito sa kabila ng pagdating ng ibang tradisyon dulot ng pagpasok ng ibang tao.

"Itong-ito pa rin ang nskagawian naming mga taga-Valenzuela tuwing pleyesta ng San Roque," ani isang matagal na residente sa lugar. Ang halos dalawang linggo pagdiriwang na nagsimula noong Mayo 3, ay sinimulan ng siyam na araw na nobena at iba't-ibang aktibidad bawat araw hanggang Mayo 13.

Barangay Punturin in a Nutshell

In early times, Punturin was pure virgin forest and at its foot ran creeks which emptied into the river of Meycauayan.

Agricultural and fishing were the only known forms of livelihood. With the onset of civilization, the people decided to clear the wilderness for more agricultural lands. From the forest came the wood materials used in setting up their homes.

Punturin in the early times was a portion of Barrio Lawang Bato. Due to the rapid growth of population, it was separated from Lawang Bato and became an independent barangay on July 04, 1954, with Gregorio Lim (1954-1956) as first Teniente del Barrio (Barangay Captain).

He was followed by Alfonso San Roque (1957-1980), Santiago Faustino (1930-1964), Lamberto F. Vellila (1964-1970), Apolonio Faustino (1970-1982), Romeo P. Bularan (1983-1987), Nicanor S. Faustino (1988-2002) and Vicente P. Trinidad (2002-2005).

The name Punturin was derived from the tagalog words "maraming Puntud o gulod ng kabutuan, meaning hills. From an agricultural area, the 162.20 hectare barangay emerged into a residential and semi-industrial area.

Today, it has a total population of 10,458, with five subdivisions namely: Sta. Lucia Village Phase III, Sta. Lucia Village Phase IV, Sta. Lucia Village Phase V, Sta. Lucia Village Phase VI and the Natividad Townhomes Subdivision, and fifty-two (52) new establishments, with their own association called "Punturin Business Association of Valenzuela (PBAV), created through the initiative of the Barangay Chairman and headed by William Lim.

At present, Barangay Punturin is known for its well developed surroundings. It has One Hundred Twenty Four (124) streetlights that makes this Barangay so bright even at night.

Peace and Order is very well maintained in this northern part of Valenzuela as the Barangay Council and its constituents work together in handling the peace situation. Everybody knows their responsibility and helps in maintaining the community peaceful, clean and orderly.

Furthermore, Punturin was recently adjudged the Cleanest and Greenest Barangay of the City, bringing home the P50,000 cash award and trophy.

Kautusan Blg. 2005-11-02 - Kautusan na ngahabawal maglalabas ng basura sa diinoklang araw, pagssabit ng basura sa mga piano, poste de labas ng tarangkahon o bokod. 2. Kautusan Blg. 2005-11-01 - Kautusan sa lahi ng may ambulant store o rolling store na naglaloko sa Brgy. Tagalag na magdala o maglalagay ng kauskulang basurahan sa kanilang kartiis.

Ang Barangay Tagalag ay isa sa pinakamahabang lugar sa Lungsod ng Valenzuela na dati'y madulas na nakaaranan ng mataas na paghaha. Sa tulog ng Pamahalaang Lungsod ay buong kahabuan ng Tagalag Road ay naitas at naimento na ngadulot ng malaking kaginhawaan at paghabago sa aming barangay. Sa Kasalukuyan ilan sa mga proyekto na napondohan ng Pamahalaang Lungsod at maaaring maaikutan ngayon taon ay ang "Improvement of Camia St., Balintawak St., Sunflower St., Waling-Waling St., & portion of Duma de Noche", gayon din ang "Widening of Tagalag Road" at pagpapatayo ng dalawang gripo.

Ang pagwaliwala mula sa pondo ng barangay sa taong 2006 na may halaga P300,033.62 ay maugang napagawa at naisakutuparan, ito ay ang "Upgrading and Cementing of Catleya St., Improvement of Multi-Purpose Hall, and Barangay Hall" at pagtatayo ng Mini-Park at Grotto na malapit sa Tanod Outpost na ikinatuwa ng inamani.

Ang Sanggunian Kabataan sa pangunguna ni SK Chairman Kristina Darilag at sa tulog ng Sanggunian Barangay, ang ginanap na Inter-Color Bowling at Basketball Tournament ay matagumpay na natapos noong nakedar Mayo taong 2006 at ilo ay ngadulot ng malaking sigla sa mga kabataan at napalawak ang pagkakaibigan at ugnayan ng maraming inamaniyang sa Barangay Tagalag.

Para sa programang pangkalinisan ang Sanggunian Barangay ay nagsaplanong bumisita sa bahay-bahay upong magpusala na maging malinis ang loob at labas ng bukurang at maiwasan ang maraming sakit na dulo ng muruming paligid at nagsophano ding magkaroong ng Medical Mission sa ika-16 ng Hulyo taong 2006. Sa pamamagitan ni Dra. Amie Sengco ay patoy parin ang Orally Fit Program sa barangay. Inaahanan din na sa huwan ng Hulyo ay magkaroong ng Day Care Center sa aming barangay sa tulog ng Pamahalaang Lungsod. Ang ngakakaisang Sanggunian Barangay ng Tagalag ay nagsapatalam at sumisuporta sa patoy na paghabago ng Lungsod ng Valenzuela na may Disiplina.


